Finance Committee Report 2023/2024

During 2023 we began a weekly stewardship update – which was added to the rotating announcements projected on our screens at all Masses prior to the start of our Eucharistic celebration. We anxiously watched as the weeks went by - updates that typically reported that our expenses for the week exceeded our donations. By the end of November, we were anticipating a significant deficit for the year. I have thanked you – our parishioners, several times and let me once again express the sincere thanks from our Finance Committee for your overwhelming response to our appeal in November. December donations were fantastic – pretty much wiping out the anticipated deficit and taking us to a break-even situation for the year – as you will see in the attached financial report.

The financial statement for the year ending December 31, 2023, is attached – here are some highlights from the year-end report:

- ➢ On the revenue side, our collections for the year ended up very positive ... with total collections of just over of \$406,000 − up from \$357,000 in 2022. As a result of the increase in donations, the year ended up with a modest surplus.
- You will note that we are showing revenues of \$5,513 as "Miscellaneous". This is mainly made up of collections which were received to cover the cost of Father George's 50th Anniversary celebration and the printing of our Parish Directory. This revenue is basically a wash as you will notice on the second last line of the expenditures listed for these 2 projects in the amount of \$4,693 ... which would leave a modest excess going to our operations.
- On the expenditure side our spending stayed within budget total expenditures were \$405,718 – as compared to a budgeted amount of \$404,240.
- ➤ With reference to the attached Balance Sheet .. you can see that we do have \$363,000 set aside for future renovations. This is a nice jump start for Ben Boots who is Chairing the Phase 2 Renovation Campaign dealing with the interior of the church. You will also note on the Balance Sheet that our overall surplus for the Parish is sitting at a modest \$25,788 this has decreased over the years because of some deficits experienced in prior years.

I would like to thank my dedicated finance committee members for their support and advice over the past year ... they are Father George and Father Bert, Marcel Gagnon, Dianne Ireland, Warren Michelson, Cathy Schick, Dale Toni and Al Rossler. Sincere condolences to the families of Dianne Ireland and Al Rossler – who have since passed away. Their contribution to the Finance Committee was much appreciated as they were both actively involved.

I end by thanking you – our faithful parishioners for your ongoing support – and encourage you to consider a small increase to your weekly donation during the upcoming year – as we will need to cover higher operating expenses because of the sharp inflationary increase we are experiencing.

I am pleased to off this report on the state of maintenance for both the Rectory and the Church

Most Notably.

• ELEVATOR - Our elevator is nearly 29 years old.

The elevator, which we all have come to rely on, was shut down for an extended period while repairs were sought at a reasonable cost. A company was finally contracted to make the necessary repairs and get it back operating.

Considering its age there are some components that will need replacing/upgrading. We are in the preliminary steps of looking at this. This will be done to ensure the continued use of our elevator.

• RECTORY -Cleaning

As Fr. George was leaving it was decided that a good cleaning of the Rectory take place. Walls were washed, carpets cleaned and two truckloads of refuse were removed from the rectory garage.

-Odours

In March an unpleasant odour was occurring in the Rectory office area. Investigations led to the discovery of yet more leaking sewer pipes in the crawlspace. Repairs were completed and the air is fresh again.

• INTERIOR/EXTERIOR

-Lighting

Failure of some of the light in and around the church has led to them being replaced with more energy-efficient types

-Kitchen

A newer, new to us, commercial-style microwave has been procured for use in the hall kitchen...thank you, Dave Lyons. Work is progressing to have it installed.

-Front Steps

As many of you are aware there are issues with the East stair entrance. Several holes have appeared. This has led to the infiltration of water into the space under the stairs and is causing some spalling of the brickwork located in the lower hall entrances. Quotes are being reviewed to have repairs completed.

We continue to meet every month alternating evenings and afternoons.

Fr. Bert Lillo was installed as our new spiritual advisor in January 2024.

Our new executive was installed during a mass in January. We have filled most of our positions.

We continue to embrace the new national CWL theme" Here I am Lord Send Me." We have transitioned to the three committees of Service, Faith and Social Justice as recommended by our National Council.

We have completed registration for the 2024 year with 113 members with 13 new or transferred members. We served a welcome social for our new members.

We continue to communicate with Church of Our Lady who hosted our Fall Gathering and will also host our service awards in May 2024.

We sold out the missals for this year. We donated \$500 to St Gertrude's to help with their furnace replacement and recently we have donated \$1,000 to the elevator fund.

Our CWL Girls League continues to thrive with monthly meetings coordinated with our evening meeting. They continue to serve within the capacity of Service, Faith & Social Justice.

We had nine members attend the World Day of Prayer in Moose Jaw. The CWL ran the Stations of the Cross during Lent.

We continue with our research on the unhoused here in Moose Jaw attending some seminars and events and working with our Pastoral Council and Knights of Columbus. The Walk for Warmth allowed us to donate \$200. This was coordinated by 2 CWL members gaining pledges and donations.

We are encouraging members to attend the CWL National Convention in Saskatoon in August 2024 and also the Diocesan Convention in Assiniboia in April 2024.

Cheryl Thul Spiritual Director at Providence Place attended our last meeting with a presentation on her work at Providence Place. This month we have invited the Holy Trinity School Board to update us on the school division and the new school.

Our fundraising capacity is through our funeral lunches. We have a great group of ladies who volunteer within our parish to help us.

We look forward to coordinating events with the Pastoral Council and the Knights of Columbus to make St Joseph's Parish a welcoming and faith-filled community.

I hope this gives you a general overview of our activities.

Holy Trinity School Division Report for St. Joseph's Annual General Meeting 2023/2024

The Holy Trinity Roman Catholic School Separate Division serves approximately 2, 345 students in nine schools in the communities of Moose Jaw, Swift Current and Shaunavon. The Holy Trinity School Board holds a public meeting monthly except for July. Meeting agendas, minutes, and board highlights are posted on the division webpage.

Each year the board appoints members to represent the HTCSD board at each of the parishes in the division. Alison Bradish is the HTCSD board representative for St. Joseph's Parish. She attends parish council meetings and submits reports based on the board's work plan for the upcoming month and highlights from the previous board meeting. The next organizational meeting where representatives of the board are appointed will take place in November after municipal elections.

Recently the board approved the naming of the newest Catholic school in Moose Jaw which is Our Lady of Hope Elementary. This school is part of a joint-use school with the public division and is scheduled to be open in 2025. The new school will replace St. Mary's and Sacred Heart.

The board will complete its strategic planning in May based on the 10-year Provincial Education Plan released in November 2023.

At the March parish council meeting a presentation was shared with St. Joseph's Parish Council about the vision and mission of our publicly funded Catholic school system that serves the communities of Moose Jaw, Swift Current and Shaunavon. This presentation was attended by Ward Strueby, the Director of Education, Joann Blazieko, HTCSD board chair, and board member Christine Boyczuk. Lisa Busta, the division chaplain, led the presentation to help inform the parish council of what is taught in our schools and how the division aims to work with parishes, and the Archdiocese of Regina, to better serve our students and staff.
